5. Make a Précis of the following passage and provide a suitable title to it.

It is evident that until doubt began, progress was impossible. For, as we have clearly seen, the advance of civilization solely depends on the acquisition made by the human intellect, and on the extent to which those acquisitions are diffused. But men who are perfectly convinced of the accuracy of their opinions will never take the pain of examining the basis on which they are built. They look always with wonder, on views contrary to those which they inherited, and when they are in this state of mind, it is impossible that they should receive any new truth which interferes with their conclusions. On this account, although the acquisition of fresh knowledge is the necessary precursor of every step in social progress, such acquisition must itself be preceded by a love of inquiry and therefore, by a spirit of doubt, because without doubt, there will be no knowledge, for knowledge is not an inert and passive principle, which comes to us, but the product of great labour and therefore, of great sacrifice.
