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## Infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

This institution is only 42 years old. Since its establishment in the year 1981, the college has been grown up significantly. This institution has a well-developed building of 3221 sq. meters with 3 blocks dedicated to teaching-learning. It is equipped with facilities like a central library with a collection of more than 26000 books, and 5 renowned print journals as well e-books and e-journals accessing facilities from the subscription UGC-INFLIBNET'S NLIST Consortium. Apart from this, different laboratories and technologically enabled classrooms for teaching to achieve academic excellence. There are 17 departments running in the college along with 2 study Centers under the Directorate of Distance Education namely. NSOU DDE (both UG and PG courses) and RBU DDE (only PG course). The college also offers Honours Course in BBA under a self-financed scheme. The institution has a number of room including office, classes and laboratories (80 in numbers) and computers (122 in numbers), although the figures shown are not adequate. The institution has a separate building for science students where separate classrooms are there for different honors subjects. In the Arts stream, the same rooms are used for different courses. The college needs more classrooms to accommodate the growing demand of the students. Laboratories are equipped with necessary instruments, chemicals, and software as per the needs of the students according to the current syllabus. Support facilities include a wellmaintained canteen, sports ground, sports room, and medicinal plants around the playground. Some classes are scheduled for maximum utilization of available physical infrastructure which includes a smart board, overhead projector, and sound system. The remaining classrooms are used for teaching in chalk and talk mode. The library is equipped with Integrated Library Management System. Koha software is being used to deal with the students' demand for books.

### Infrastructure Development project during 2021-22

The College has taken two distinctive initiatives after CoVID Pandemic—

• *Vertical Extension of staff Canteen:* The College already had constructed the staff canteen before Pandemic. In the end of December, 2021, the college has taken initiative to construct the vertical extension of staff canteen with an approximate budget of 10 Lacks, generating the fund from the own fund of the college. This project was ended during June, 2022.





• *Construction of Underground Drainage:* By the end of January, 2022, the construction of an underground drainage system was initiated for the disposal of liquid waste of the administrative building. The College took this project with an approximate budget of 13 Lacks, again generating from own fund of the college. The project has been successfully ended in March, 2022.
