- 4. Would you regard Juggut Singh as a villain or a hero in *Train to Pakistan*? Give reasons for your answer.
- 5. Give a contrasted reading of Lenny's mother and Godmother in *Ice-Candy Man*.
- 6. Examine the scenes of violence in Bhisham Sahni's novel, *Tamas*, and show how they reflect the brutality unleashed by Partition.

GROUP-H

- 1. Critically analyze Satyajit Ray's handling of mystery in 'Professor Shonku and the UFO'.

- 3. What is the role of Red and Mary Jane in the plot structure of *Inspector Ghote Goes by Train*?
- 4. Comment on the human-alien interaction in Satyajit Ray's 'Professor Shonku and the UFO'.
- 5. Justify the appropriateness of the title of *Inspector Ghote Goes by Train*.
- 6. What are Holmes's techniques of detection? Give suitable examples from *The Hound of the Baskervilles*.
