ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Our college, Sukanta Mahavidyalaya, named after the eminent Bengali poet Sri Sukanta Bhattacharya (1926-1947), was established on 25th September, 1981 at Sukanta Nagar, P.O. – Dhupguri, Dist. – Jalpaiguri, West Bengal. It is a Government-aided Degree College, permanently affiliated to the University of North Bengal and enlisted under Section 2(F) and 12 (B) of the U.G.C. Act, 1956. It is situated on the Dhupguri – Falakata Road and reachable from the district town Jalpaiguri in one hour journey by bus or train. The college is situated in an area known as Dooars which is the tea belt of North Bengal other than Darjeeling.

The College has successfully completed the second circle of NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) visit during May, 2023 and subsequently was awarded Grade “B+” with CGPA 2.73 which is no doubt an outstanding achievement in the history of Sukanta Mahavidyalaya. Considering the importance of NAAC visit the college authority was provided so many facilities both for stakeholders, faculties and employees of the college.

It is a great pleasure for us that the Directorate of “Rastriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan” (RUSA), MHRD, Govt. of India has identified this institution as a recipient of the sanction of Two Crore for infrastructural development of the college. The College has successfully implemented RUSA project. Apart from that, our new Science Block is constructed out of the grants offered by North Bengal Development Department (NBDD), Govt. of West Bengal.

OUR CAMPUS

The college is located in the heart of Dhupguri Municipality, situated on the Dhupguri – Falakata Road and is accessible by public transport. One can also reach the college by Railway (nearest Railway Station is Dhupguri Railway Station). The college is 5 kilometres away from Dhupguri Railway Station.

Built on the plot of 6.2 acres in Dhupguri, the campus of the college consists of the following buildings:

The Administrative Building (Block A), which is the main building, is constituting with Principal's Office, Meeting Room, College Office Section, Account Section, Examination Section and Library. This block also accommodates IQAC Cell, NRC Room and Alumni Room.

The Annexe Building (Block B) is constituting with Teacher's Room, Virtual Classrooms, Smart Classrooms and several normal Classrooms, Seminar Halls funded by RUSA, RBU-DDE Office, N.S.S. Unit, N.C.C. Unit, College Guest Room and Staff Canteen.

The Composite Building (Block C), located beside the Administrative Building, is constituting mainly Classrooms. This block houses the Department of Geography, Physical Education, Botany and Zoology. The Block also houses the BBA Section, which is our self-financing course. The Block also houses the NSOU Section, a DDE unit which organises different UG and PG courses in distance mode.

The Block D, newly constructed building and inaugurated by in 2019, accommodates the Gymnasium, Student Common room, Students' Canteen, and Students' Union.

The Science Building (Block E), another newly constructed building under the NBDD fund, presently houses the Departments of Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science and Mathematics. The Block also accommodates one Principal's Office, one Teacher's Room in the ground floor in addition to several classrooms. Recently, vertical expansion of Block E is going on.

Departments:

The College has 18 undergraduate departments combining both the Arts and Science faculties where Honours courses are taught. Apart from these, the College runs one professional course *i.e.*, Bachelor of Business Administration course since 2006 under the affiliation of the University of North Bengal.



STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM

Students' Common Room: The College has well equipped and advanced Students' Common Room in Block D with all amenities and some indoor sports facilities for the students. Block D also houses a separate Girls' Common Room, in addition to Students' Common Room.

Multi-gym Facility: The Block D houses a new and well-equipped 16 station multi-gym facilities such as bi-cycle, twister, ergo meter, biceps curling, leg curl, leg press, chest extension, triceps curl, back pulling, dumble exercise, burble exercise, wrist rolling and jogger for providing a way to exercise physically.



Sports Facilities: The College sports room has arrangement for games like carrom, chess and table tennis. There is also a Badminton Court in the college campus. Three faculty members is usually engaged to train the students in different sports activities. The College organizes the Annual Sports in its own play ground in the winter every year. Besides this, the College also participates in various inter-college, district-level, state-level and national-level sports events and has many prizes to its credit.

Students' Mentoring: All departments actively mentor students on a regular basis catering to the academic and psychological needs of the students. Each student of each department is assigned to a mentor in every academic session.

Sick Room: The college has sick room facilities for the students as well as staff members in Block A, such as sick bed, stretcher including First-Aid facilities.



Student Canteen: The Block D also accommodates the Students' Canteen for their refreshment. The canteen is run by a voluntary organisation and functions during the working hours of the college. Students of the college can buy fresh food at a reasonable rate. Junk food is banned in the canteen as per UGC rule.

Smart and Virtual Classrooms: The college currently has 9 (seven) Smart Classrooms and 1 Virtual Classroom for the purpose of better learning and teaching of the primary stakeholders.



Photocopy Centre: The students can avail of photocopy facility at a low price. The photocopy facility is available at Block A (Administrative Building).



Career Counselling and Placement Cell: Career Counselling Cell of the College organizes campus recruitment drives through which a good number of students are placed in different organizations each year. The cell also conducts interactive seminars and workshops on career guidance and presentation skills.

Right to Information: The College has an Information Officer to whom the students and the staff may seek help regarding the rules of RTI (Right to Information).

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC): The college has an Internal Complaints Committee constituted according to UGC Notification (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of women employees and students in higher educational Institutions Regulations, 2015) to prevent and take appropriate action against sexual harassment in the institution. This committee headed by the Principal has both male and female representatives from teaching as well as non-teaching staff and also student representatives as per guidelines.

Anti-Ragging Cell: Ragging is strictly prohibited in Sukanta Mahavidyalaya as per UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (under section 26(1)(g) of the UGC Act 1956). An Anti-Ragging Cell has been constituted according to UGC norms. Starting 2017, all Anti-Ragging Declaration forms are to be submitted online at www.antiragging.in or students can send an e-mail to anti-ragging@sukantamahavidyalaya.ac.in. The Anti-Ragging policy document is also uploaded on the college website for general information.

Grievance Redressal: The College has a strong grievance redressal system. Depending on the nature of grievance, students may seek redressal from the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), the Grievance Committee and the Anti Ragging Committee. Students may register their complaints/ grievances / suggestions (if any) physically in the college 'Grievance Box' or may fill up the Grievance Form available on the college website. The Grievance Redressal policy document is also uploaded on the college website for general information.

Students' Aid Fund: Examination fees and tuition fees are provided to the economically disadvantaged and needy students from **Students' Aid Fund** after receiving proper application. This fund is totally on grounds of merit. Apart from Students' Aid Fund, the students can avail the following State and National level Scholarship/Stipend as well as private Scholarship/Stipend on the basis of merit.

A. State and National level Scholarship/Stipend:

1. Free Studentship: Awarded by the Director of Public Instructions, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, to needy and deserving candidates on the recommendation of the Principal provided her family income does not exceed Rs. 80000 per annum. Application forms and detailed information can be obtained from the Students' Aid Fund Committee.
2. Kanyashree Scholarship: All students attaining eighteen years of age and unmarried are eligible to apply for Kanyashree grant. There is no upper limit on the family income to apply for Kanyashree grant. Students must contact the concerned person of the College and also follow the notices displayed on the College notice board.



3. Students' Credit Card Scheme: It is a new initiative by the State Govt. to avail educational loan by the needy students. For further details visit www.wb.gov.in or <https://banglaruchchashiksha.wb.gov.in> and click STUDENT CREDIT CARD tab or Log in to <https://wbccc.wb.gov.in>. Apart from this college has appointed one Nodal Officer for the SCC scheme. Students can contact the Nodal Officer for any kind of help.
4. Swami Vivekananda Scholarship on merit cum means basis: All the students in the U.G. course with family income not exceeding Rs 250000 per annum may apply for this scholarship.
5. Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means (for non-minority students): Applicants should have secured 60% marks and above at the H.S. level to be eligible for this grant which is Rs. 12,000/- per annum for the B.A. Course of study and Rs. 30,000/- per annum for B.Sc. students.
6. Chief Minister Relief Fund: Applicants should have scored 60% marks in the HS Examination and the scholarship can be renewed only if the candidate continues to score 60% marks at the next examination. Under this scheme, each student gets Rs. 10000/- per annum.
7. Aikyashree Scholarship: It is only for the students of the minority community and there are three types of grants:
8. T.S.P.: Students who have scored below 50% marks at the HS level and whose family income is below Rs. 2 lakh per annum are eligible for this grant of Rs. 5500/-annum; the same criteria are applied for renewal.
9. Post-matric Scholarship: Students who have 50% marks and above at the HS level and whose family income does not exceed Rs. 2.5 lakh can apply for this grant of Rs. 7500/- per annum; the same criteria are applied for renewal.

B. Scholarship by Private Trusts:

1. S. R Jindal Scholarship.

Special attention is paid to the progress and attendance of scholarship holders. Scholarships, stipends, full free and half free studentships, etc., may be withdrawn at any time on proof of unsatisfactory progress or conduct, unexplained absence or for any other sufficient reason.

National Service Scheme (NSS): The College has National Service Scheme (NSS) wing for conducting different activities and outreach activities which include special camp, orphanage



and slum visits, awareness programs on World AIDS Day, Thalassemia, Blood donation camp and other health issues, campus cleanliness drives, old cloth distribution, health camp. The NSS wing has **three units**, which are headed by NSS Programme Officers. The willing students can join the NSS Units. Apart from this, the NSS units regularly conduct Certificate Course for UG students.

National Cadet Corps (NCC): The College also has National Cadet Corps (NCC) wing for conducting different activities, awareness programme, and outreach activities. The wing has unit under 61, Bengal Bn. The willing students can join the NCC Unit.

Eco Club: The College recently formed Eco-Club for sensitizing students about the need for conservation of the environment.

excellence. Apart from Rabindra Kaksha, the College has another Seminar Hall in Block B named B004.

Computer Centre: The College has two Computer Centre for conducting career-oriented program for all the students.

Laboratory Rooms: The college has well-equipped science laboratories namely Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany and Computer Science laboratory in Block C and Block E. Recently, Geography Laboratory is upgraded for better teaching for students and situated in Block C.

PG Study Centre (RBU-DDE & N.S.O.U.): The college has Post-Graduate (PG) Study Centre of Rabindra Bharati University under Directorate of Distance Education in Block B. It offers master degree courses under distant mode of education in the subjects namely Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Political Science, History, Education and Environmental Studies. Examinations are also conducted at the study centre. The College also has Study Centre of Netaji Subhas Open University in Block C. The centre offers UG course on different subjects as well as PG courses.

UGC NRC Centre: The College has one network resourcing centre by RUSA fund for students as well as staff members to create awareness about use of the computer in various activities like administration, finance, examination and research in Block A. The centre enables the stakeholders to access multimedia material in teaching and learning at places of eminence in India & Abroad.

Open Stage: The college has an open stage, "Mukta Mancha" for organizing various outdoor college programmes.

Drinking Water Facilities: The college has installed purified drinking water facilities (Aquagaurd) in each and every Block for smooth drinking water supply.



Seminar Hall: The College has well decorated seminar hall, named, "Rabindra Kaksha" with a seating capacity of more than 150 fellows and with technically sound audio-visual aids in Block B. Many National level and International level seminars have been organised to enhance our academic



Disable-Friendly Facilities: The college provides different types of facilities for admitted disable-friendly students like ramp, disable-friendly washroom, provides wheel chairs to needy students, audio gadgets, etc. Ramp is available in all Blocks. Recently, an additional disable-friendly washroom is constructed in college playground.



Pollution Monitoring Facilities: In recent time, another best initiative taken by our college is set up of Sensor-based Air Quality and Noise Level Monitoring station within the campus under the aegis of West Bengal Pollution Control Board, Government of West Bengal.

Alumni Association: The College has one registered Alumni Association, named as The Sukanta Mahavidyalaya Alumni Association, under the West Bengal Society Registration Act XXVI of 1961 and the registration no. is 99967 of 2012-2013. This Association is open to all to join after completing their course. The Alumni Association conducts different kinds of programme throughout the year.

CERTIFICATE COURSES

The College current conducting two certificate courses every year namely One Year Certificate Course in Computer Application and Two-Year Diploma Course in Computer Application for all newly admitted students (classes held according to routine within college hours). These courses are conducted by the Department of BBA. All students are advised to take admission in this course. The admission fee for both the courses is Rs. 225/-. In addition to this course fee of Rs. 200/- per month is charged per student. Recently, a number of Add-on/certificate/value-added courses organized by the college from Ay 2024-2025 session.

Departmental Seminar: Most of the Departments organise at least two departmental seminars in each session as part of co-curricular activities by eminent speakers in the respective fields. All students are to attend the seminars of their respective departments mandatorily.

Educational Tours and Excursions: As per rule of the University of University, Education, History, Bengali, Geography, Environmental Science departments take their students on excursions/tours related to academic projects in their respective areas. The charges of excursions are to be paid by the students separately. At least one faculty member accompanies the students on excursions. Besides the compulsory excursions, other departments also organise educational trips to places of historical and cultural significance. Students are also taken to various symposiums, seminars and workshops, research institutes and exhibitions pertaining to their subjects of study.

ADMISSION TO THREE/FOUR YEAR DEGREE COURSE

(All information regarding current admission is available in <http://wbcap.in/>)

As per the instruction by the affiliating university (The University of North Bengal) our college, Sukanta Mahavidyalaya had been implemented the National Curriculum and Credit Framework (NCCF) from the Academic Session 2023-2024 with the best resources of the college. As the new system is variety in nature, for the **Session 2025-2026**, we offer a variety of subject combination in different courses.

Students who have passed Higher Secondary, ISC, CBSE, or its equivalent examinations both in India and abroad, approved by the University of North Bengal are eligible to apply. Candidates from Vocational Stream are not eligible to apply. Admission process is conducted entirely in online mode.

Eligibility for Admission

Single Major and Single Minor course:

% of Marks:

A student shall be allowed to take admission in the Single Major and Single Minor course of B.A. /B.Sc./B.Com. if he/ she has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary [10+2] Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.

Provided that a candidate who has obtained- (a) 55% marks in the aggregate, or (b) 50% in the aggregate with 60% marks in a subject / related subject in the last qualifying Examination shall be eligible to apply for Single Major and Single Minor course in that subject.

Admission shall however be on merit and availability of seats.

Provided that for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PWD candidates- the minimum marks for eligibility shall be as per Rules of the State Government.

Provided further that in matter of eligibility 54.5% marks or above shall be equal to 55%, 49.5% and above shall be equal to 50% and 59.5 marks or above shall be equal to 60%.

Three Discipline Specific Courses (Multidisciplinary):

A student shall be allowed to take admission in the Multidisciplinary Course of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA/BBA (TAH) if he/ she has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary [10+2] Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.

A candidate shall be allowed to pursue B.A. / B. Sc. / B. Com / BBA / BCA / BBA (TAH) Multidisciplinary Course if he/ she has passed the qualifying Examination in Vocational Stream subjects. Such students shall have the option to study up to the end of 6th semester.

Choice of Major/Minor Courses for Single Major & Single Minor and three Discipline specific Multidisciplinary courses:



- ❖ A student will be allowed to take up any subject except Computer Science/Microbiology and such other interdisciplinary subjects if he/she has passed in the said subject/related subject at the HS (10+2) examination or any other board recognized as equivalent by the University.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Sociology or Psychology or Education or Mass Communication & Journalism or BBA or BCA or BBA (TAH) if he/she has passed in the previous qualifying examination of any stream.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up B.Com. if he/she has studied Science subjects along with Mathematics in the previous qualifying exams.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Physics Subject if he/she has passed in Mathematics and Chemistry along with Physics and other subject as prescribed at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Chemistry Subject if he/she has passed in Mathematics and Physics along with Chemistry and other subject as prescribed at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Botany/Zoology Subject if he/she has passed in Biology at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Physiology subject if he/she has passed in Biology at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Computer Science Subject if he/she has passed in Mathematics or Statistics at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Microbiology Subject if he/she has passed in Chemistry and Biology at the qualifying Examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Economics as if he/she has passed in Mathematics or Applied Mathematics or Business Economics including Business Mathematics, and other subjects as prescribed at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Geography subject if he/she has passed in Geography at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Geology subject if he/she has passed in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry at the qualifying examination.
- ❖ A candidate pursuing Major in a subject will not be allowed to take up the same subject as Minor.
- ❖ While taking Major & Minor subjects, availability of the said subjects in the concerned Colleges will be taken into cognizance.

Merit Point Calculation

For a Single Major and Single Minor course (4-year UG), where a student has studied the subject at +2 level = $(\text{Marks obtained in Major/ related subject} + \text{Marks obtained in English} + \text{Best marks obtained in other two subjects}) / 4$.

For a Single Major and Single Minor course (4-year UG), where a student has not studied the subject at +2 level = $(\text{Marks obtained in English} + \text{Best marks obtained in other three subjects}) / 4$.

For a three-discipline specific Multidisciplinary course
= $(\text{Marks obtained in English} + \text{Marks obtained in 3 Core / related subjects}) / 4$.

Seat Reservation Policy

There will be reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS/Differently-Abled Candidates as per Government Rules. For differently-abled candidates' minimum disability at least 40% will be considered.



Session Gap

For admission to the Undergraduate Program there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary Examination and the year of admission to Undergraduate Program of study.

Session Break

Students who exit with Undergraduate Certificate or Undergraduate Diploma, are permitted to re-enter within 3 (three) years and complete the Degree Program. Students are also permitted to take a break from the study, during the period of study, but the total duration for completing the program will not exceed seven years.

Admission on Transfer

If a student has been admitted to a college, he/she/transgender will not, except as otherwise provided in the Ordinances, be subsequently admitted to any other College without the production of a Transfer Certificate from the Principal of the College in which he/she/transgender studied last.

A student admitted to a college, will not ordinarily be allowed to take transfer to any other College, except at the end of a semester. If an application for transfer is made at any time, other than at the end of a Semester, on the ground of (a) transfer of the parent / guardian of the student from the station at which the College is situated, or (b) reasoned need for a change on the ground of health supported by proper medical evidence, or any other sufficient reason, the Principal may grant the transfer.

A student may apply for transfer within one month from the date of publication of semester-end examination and the student should qualify all the previous semester examinations without any back paper(s).

Admission on Transfer should abide by the following stipulations:

A candidate taking transfer from one College to another is required to pursue the same set of courses of study in both the colleges;

- Admission on transfer must not violate the approved intake of the course concerned of the College granting admission. Only in cases of wards of Government employees who have been transferred, a relaxation of intake may be granted with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor;
- Cases of admission on transfer must be intimated in writing to the University authority by the College admitting such candidates within a fortnight of such admission without which such admission on transfer will not be recognized;
- All other steps and procedures related to transfer will be in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances.

Session

The Academic Session commences from July every year with the odd semesters, namely, 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th semesters. Odd semester spans from July to December of each Calendar Year. According to University stipulations, classes for the next semester *i.e.*, even semesters will start immediately after seven days of the completion of the previous semester's examination. Even semesters comprise of 2nd, 4th, 6th and 8th semesters and spans from January to June of each Calendar Year.

Attendance to the College

As per University of North Bengal Guidelines, no student shall be allowed to take the end semester written Examination if the student concerned has not attended minimum of **75% of the classes** held in the course concerned and also in other curricular components.

Further, a candidate to be eligible for appearing at any of the Semesters of UNDER-GRADUATE Examination must have minimum **75% attendance of lectures** delivered. **Award of 05 (five) marks on class attendance** shall be given in the following manner:

- Attendance of 75% and above but below 80% -- 02 marks
- Attendance of 80% and above but below 85% -- 03 marks
- Attendance of 85% and above but below 90% -- 04 marks
- Attendance of 90% and above -- 05 marks

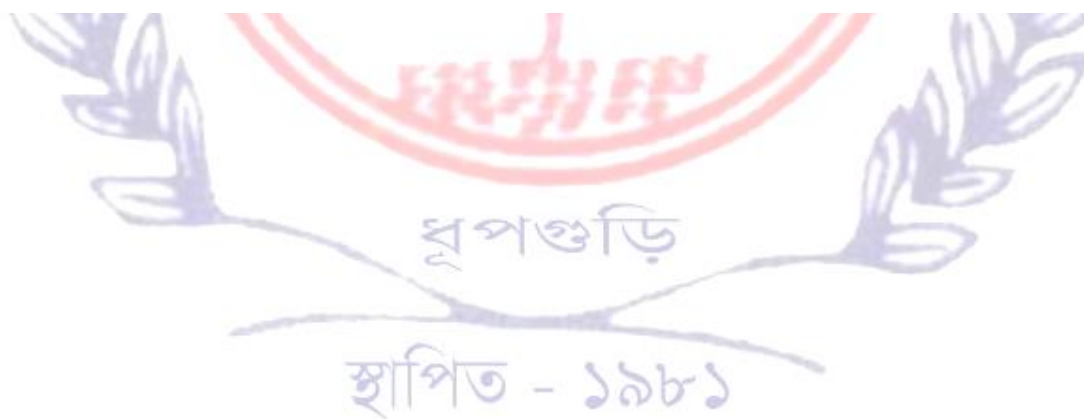

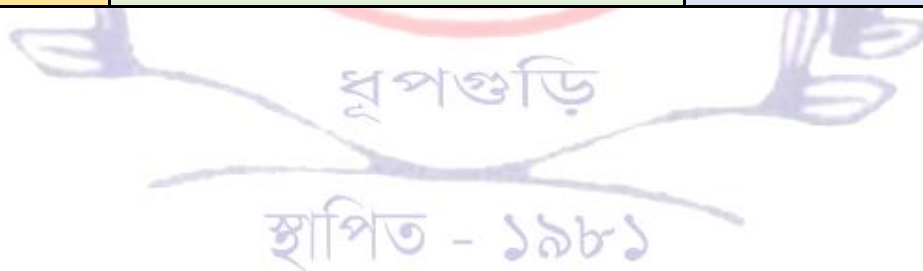
